Minutes of the Salt Lake Astronomical Society

Special Board Meeting, 15 November 2006

SLAS President Lowell Lyon called the meeting to order in the home of SLAS member Ann House at 7:30 p.m. Members of the 2006 & 2007 boards in attendance were Lowell Lyon, Bill Kennedy, Rodger Fry, Ann House & Bob Moore. Nova editor Patrick Wiggins was also there as was Jess Clifford of <u>Clifford Studios</u> who designed the current SLAS logo & the logos for the SPOC grand opening T-shirts & the 2002 Astronomical League convention.

Lowell noted that the purpose of the meeting was to follow up on the extensive work done by 2006 SLAS VP Tom Sevcik & seriously discuss how the club should go about producing a SLAS marketing brochure. The purpose of the brochure would be to increase awareness of the club & to recruit new members.

Mr. Clifford explained what would be involved in designing an effective, professional looking brochure & showed samples of his work. This was followed by much discussion.

Cost of designing the brochure was estimated at under \$1,000. Cost of printing 10,000 brochures was estimated to be about \$1,200.

In the end all three members of the 2006 board who were in attendance, Lowell Lyon, Bill Kennedy & Rodger Fry, voted to recommend to the general membership that the club contract with Mr. Clifford to design a SLAS marketing brochure.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:40 p.m.

Board Meeting, 28 November 2006

SLAS President Lowell Lyon called the meeting to order in room 105 of the University of Utah's Engineering/Mines building at 6:35 p.m. Those in attendance included board members Bill Kennedy, Rodger Fry & Tom Sevcik as well as newsletter editor Patrick Wiggins & several SLAS members.

Lowell said he had spoken with the club's insurance agent & found the cost of insuring the h-alpha filter & telescope would be \$250 per year. He is going to look into lesser rates if just the filter were covered &/or the deductible were raised.

More discussion about the proposed SLAS marketing brochure.

The Harmons in Midvale has offered to host Sun parties but the board decided to continue with the Winchester Park site. Hours of next year's Sun parties were changed to 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Patrick said he had spoken with Roger Butz & that Roger has arranged to have the 2007 star party brochures printed at no charge to SLAS. Lowell said he would email Roger the master brochure the following day.

Tom said he would email the missing minutes for the January, February & March 2007 SLAS meetings to the editor by the coming weekend.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 p.m.

General Meeting, 28 November 2006

SLAS President Lowell Lyon called the meeting to order in room 105 of the University of Utah's Engineering/Mines building at 7:35 p.m. There were about 60 people in attendance.

Lowell opened the meeting by asking anyone who was attending a SLAS meeting for the first time to stand & be recognized. Several did (most being U of U students).

Lowell reminded everyone that beginning in January SLAS meetings will be held on the 3rd Tuesday of each month.

The members of the of the board were introduced.

The evening's guest speaker was Dr. Clark Christensen from BYU. Dr. Christensen spoke on the possibilities of life in the Universe.

Tom Sevcik has finished a DVD of Dr. Dale Ostlie's talk at the October SLAS meeting. The DVD will be available for loan from the club library.

Sign up sheets for next month's SLAS Solstice Festival were passed around.

Lowell noted that this year's transitional board meeting will be held the evening of Wednesday, 13 December at the the home of SLAS members Karla & Martin Van Hemert & that the Solstice Party would be held on 9 December at the Lutheran Church on Foothill Drive.

The times of next year's Sun parties will be 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

The treasurer's report was posted. It showed:

There was a brief discussion of the much discussed SLAS marketing brochure followed by the members present voting to approve spending up to \$2,500 to have the brochure professionally designed & 10,000 copies printed. Additional copies could be printed later if needed. Lowell noted that the brochure would be general enough to stay current for several years. The \$2,500.00 will come from the General Fund.

Rodger Fry reported that details & sign up information for the Solstice Festival were on the SLAS web site.

Dave Bernson noted that there would be a rare grouping of planets the morning after the festival & reminded everyone that the annual Geminids meteor shower was set for mid α

The meeting was adjourned at 9:05 p.m.

Transitional Board Meeting for 13 December 2006

SLAS President Lowell Lyon called the meeting to order in the home of SLAS members Martin & Karla Van Hemert at 7:10~p.m.

Present were most members of the 2006 & 2007 boards (Lowell Lyon, Erik Hansen, Rodger Fry, Bill Kennedy, Bob Moore & Ann House), webmaster Ken Warner, equipment manager Roger Butz, newsletter editor Patrick Wiggins & observatory director Bruce Grim.

The meeting opened with what turned out to be the most debated topic of the evening when Ken Warner suggested that with so few members requesting paper copies of the club's newsletter those receiving paper copies should pay the actual cost of the paper copies.

Patrick Wiggins reported that the actual cost to the SLAS treasury of preparing, printing & mailing a year's worth (6 issues) of the newsletter works out to about \$6.90 per person. But, since only 47 of the current 184 members are receiving paper copies, charging everyone \$4.50 per year for the newsletter has more than covered the cost of the paper copies.

As can be seen below, in the end it was decided to charge everyone \$3.00 for Postage & Printing, with \$2.00 going to subsidize the paper copies of the newsletter for those who request paper & \$1.00 to cover the cost of production & mailing of the SLAS election ballot which must be snail-mailed to all members.

Next up was a discussion of the club's insurance. There is still a possibility that SLAS will buy additional insurance for the club's H-alpha filter so the cost of insurance per member per year was raised from \$4.00 to \$5.00.

The one other budget item to produce some discussion was the current line item for the Astronomical League. Several months ago the League changed it's policy of requiring all AL affiliate club members to also pay dues to the AL. The League now says membership in the League is optional but leaves the final decision up to the individual clubs. The boards agreed to continue the practice of having all SLAS members pay dues to the Astronomical League.

Following brief discussions about the remaining items in the budget the following dues structure was approved & will be voted on by the members present at SLAS's January general meeting.

Roger Butz reported that all materials for the 2007 star party brochures are at the printers & that the brochures should be available at the January meeting. Roger added that the brochures are being printed at no charge to SLAS by the Tooele Transcript Bulletin.

Lowell said a variety of sample brochures to gather ideas was given to the firm designing the SLAS marketing brochure.

Ann House is looking into the possibility of a ZAP grant.

Bob Moore said he plans on discussing ways to improve the club's outreach program at the January meeting & asked all board members to come to the meeting with suggestions.

Next year's board was authorized to follow the existing protocol & make individual expenditures of up to \$200.00 without receiving prior approval from the membership.

Duties for the various elected & appointed positions were set & are listed near the bottom of this newsletter.

Ann said it might be a good idea to add another person to the the club's roster of NASA Night Sky Ambassadors. She has someone in mind & will followup later.

There are three boxes of SLAS t-shirts in storage at SPOC. What to do with them will be discussed at the January board meeting.

The 2007 Solstice Festival was scheduled for Saturday, 8 December & the 2007 Transitional Board meeting set for Wednesday, 12 December.

Ken Warner reminded everyone that it is his & his wife's job to keep the SLAS web site up & running but it is up to the board &, in some cases, individual members to post data on the site. Ken offered to show interested members how to add to the site.

Erik Hansen will work with Ken Warner to put more of the club's financial records on the club's web site & make them accessible to all members.

Karla Van Hemert agreed to continue to oversee the club's New Member Booklet "Unless," she said, "someone else wants the job".

Ken noted that a March/April issue of Nova was never produced. Patrick & Lowell outlined the problems they have had with getting meeting minutes that were to appear in that issue.

Patrick said he had all but given up on getting official minutes from the previous editor but would advertise in News for people's recollections of the 2006 January, February & March 2006 board & general meetings & try to have something on line by the end of the month.

Lowell thanked Karla & Martin for allowing the meeting to be held in their home.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m.
