MINUTES OF THE SALT LAKE ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY BOARD MEETING March 9, 2016

Board members in attendance: Joan Carman, Ryan Simpkins, Aleta Cox, Don Knowlton and Rodger Fry

General members in attendance: Nate Goodman, Dave Bernson, Sue Baxter, Enid Norton, Charlie Green, Patrick Wiggins, Siegfried Jachmann, Alpine Stringham, Lowell Lyon, Kathy & Mike Terry.

Meeting called to order: 7:02 PM

Financial Report

The financial report was reviewed as listed on the web site as March 01, 2016 Financial Statement

It was noted that the total of assets listed on the agenda's financial report was in error by \$0.03. A comparison of the financial records show that the amount listed on the agenda for the ZAP grant was in error (\$5,165.02 when it is actually \$5,165.05).

Board Member Reports:

Ryan Simpkins noted that more people are using SLAS Talk. He also noted that the word is out that we are considering placing the Clements 1.8-meter telescope at SPOC and that Stansbury Park residents are responding positively on SLAS Talk.

Aleta Cox said that a group contacted her about holding a private star party to a group of at-risk girls (about 13 in number) in a lock-down facility located about 39th south and State Street. Rodger Fry indicated that we should get more information and it would be good to support this cause if we can. Aleta will get more information. Aleta also indicated that Magna Library would like us to put on a star party at their library in August. She will get this scheduled. We also have a scheduled star party at St. Olaf's School in Bountiful on Monday, May 13th.

Don Knowlton has sent out 130 emails to identify possible intern candidates but so far has not got responses. He will be contacting school administrators and teachers by phone. Patrick Wiggins indicated that he has email contacts for principals and administrators in Tooele and will be glad to send emails to them. It was suggested that Don Knowlton contact the U of U and Salt Lake Community College to find interns.

SPOC Report

Rodger Fry indicated that all three telescopes at SPOC are now operational and the observatory is open for instructor training. Some training has taken place on the Refractor and the Grim telescopes and instructor refresher training on the Ealing is scheduled for this Friday, March 11th weather permitting.

Rodger Fry also summarized the status of the plan to put the 1.8-meter Clements telescope at SPOC. The Stansbury Park Association will be meeting with Tooele City Council sometime in the next two weeks and we will then have a better idea on what course of action should be taken.

Vatican Astronomer at Juan Diego Catholic High School

Joan Carman indicated that SLAS will be setting up our display at the Juan Diego School about 1:00 PM on Sunday, March 13, 2016 (she noted to remember that daylight savings time goes into effect that morning). The display will be set up along with others and viewed by visitors between 2:00-3:00 PM. The astronomer will be speaking from 3:00-4:00 PM. Rodger Fry agreed to help set up. Enid Norton and Sue Baxter also volunteered to help set up. Joan indicated that the SLAS display will be brought up there by the Clarke Planetarium staff and that Juan Diego would provide a table.

Library Loaner Scope Program

Joan Carman said that the contact with the Salt Lake County Library systems and their board were thrilled with our proposal to provide loaner telescopes to the library system. The telescopes have been ordered and must be modified to make them novice-user friendly. A discussion was made about the EZ-finder telescope and the need to modify this or using a 6X30 finder telescope. An investigation will be made into modifying the EZ-finder battery system or replacing the switch to a push button to activate it while the button is depressed (thus preserving the battery). A time to assemble the telescopes was not established. Those who agreed to help assemble the telescopes are: Ryan Simpkins, Dave Bernson, Don Knowlton, Nate Goodman and Rodger Fry.

2016 SLAStrofest

Joan Carman indicated that she was waiting to hear back from the Salt Lake Community College about holding the event there but she has not yet received a reply. She presented a tentative agenda for the event but the date or location has yet to be determined.

Report on Wild Apricot

Ryan Simpkins indicated that the beta test of the web site is up and running and can be accessed at:

He suggested that each of us test this out by loading in a dummy member file and look at what has been set up.

Fund Raising

Joan talked about the possibility of purchasing flash-drives with the SLAS logo imprinted on them. We could then sell them or give them away as prizes. Ryan Simpkins indicated that if we do this we should get the small flash —drives (2gb) and load them with information useful to the new astronomer. We should also provide these to new members. Several members indicated that "Why should we consider fund raisers when we have over \$22K in the bank?" The discussion for the flash drive was deferred to a future meeting.

Old Business

It was suggested by Ryan Simpkins that we should establish a legal document audit of all our agreements to make certain that we remain in compliance with our agreements in place. This also led to a discussion about the need to have an asset accounting ledger to document the value of our physical assets primarily at SPOC.

New Business

Lowell Lyon presented a discussion about the Astro-Con convention held in conjunction with the total solar eclipse to occur in August 2017. He indicated that pre-registration is at unprecedented levels and will likely exceed all previous Astronomy League conventions. This is being held in Casper, Wyoming. Lowell would like to have SLAS have a booth at a cost of \$80.00. This is feasible if we can get the volunteers to man the booth.

Pay Bills

A check was written to Rodger Fry for \$17.05 in compensation for the printing of photos of SPOC for the planning of the Clements 1.8-meter telescope (funds from the SPOC account). A check was written to Sky & Telescope (\$32.95 from S&T account) for the pre-payment of a members subscription, one Atilla Danko for the Clear Sky Clock support on our web-site (\$50.00 from general fund) and one to Joan Carman in the amount of \$1,451.33 for the Wheeler Banner and the library loaner telescopes (\$261.62 from ZAP account and \$1,189.71 Adobe account).

Meeting called to order: 7:01 PM

Financial Report

The financial report was reviewed as listed on the web site as April 08, 2016 Financial Statement (it was late posting because my computer died).

Board Member Reports:

Ryan Simpkins presented SLAS with a check from Adobe in the amount of \$220.00 which was from a \$110.00 donation from the Simpkins family and the matching contribution from Adobe. He also pointed out that because of the Facebook ad that cost \$50.00 we had 23,000 visitors to our Facebook page and out of these 220 are permanent followers (OUTSTANDING free advertising)! Ryan also reported that the Wheeler Farm star party held on April 1, 2016 was a big success with 200 visitors. He also mentioned that 85 people visited the new Wild-Apricot web site (one logged in as Donald Trump).

Aleta Cox reported on the special star party held at the U of U med center Girls lock-down facility on Monday night and expressed that it was an excellent star party and the 9 girls in attendance were very thankful and enjoyed our being there. She reported on the school star party at Olympus Jr High on Tuesday night and said that we had 12-15 telescopes and about 150 students and their parents in attendance. Scheduled special star parties include St. Olaf's in Bountiful on May 16, 2016, June 13th at the Tooele library, July 11th at the Magna Library. Jordanelle State Park and Capitol Reef are interested in having us put on a star party there but no dates have been set.

Don Knowlton said that he is finding success in getting volunteers to operate the telescopes at the SPOC star parties.

SPOC Report

Rodger Fry indicated that the first star party at SPOC was a big success and that the seeing was excellent. We had over 15 telescopes brought by volunteers and about 100 visitors. He also indicated that we have a work project scheduled for this coming Saturday, April 16, 2016 starting at 4:00 PM.

SLAS Corporate Fund Raising Certificate

Rodger Fry expressed an apology for letting the certificate expire (his laptop died and had to get it replaced at that time stopping work for a week). The permit has been submitted along with all requested documentation and payment. We can now solicit funds as we wish.

Mike Clements Telescope

Rodger Fry summarized progress on the plans to house the Clements 1.8-meter telescope at SPOC. It was reported that contracts between SLAS and Stansbury Park and SLAS and Mike Clements are being reviewed by Peter Waldo, a SLAS Member who is an attorney and the review should be complete in the next day or so. It was also reported that Rodger Fry, Mike Clements and Charley Green joined with Glenn Oscarson and Randall Jones in meeting with the Tooele County Commission on Tuesday evening. At that meeting, Rodger Fry presented a PowerPoint presentation about SLAS and the plans to put the telescope at SPOC. In a phone call between the commission and Glenn Oscarson on Wednesday, it was indicated that Tooele County will be making funds available for the project.

Library Loaner Scope Program

Joan Carman said that the library loaner telescope is well underway and brought one telescope in as an example. She explained about the modifications that are required. She further explained that the Library system has asked that we purchase four additional telescopes that they will reimburse us for making the total eight telescopes. These will be placed, two in each of the following libraries: Magna, Riverton, Herriman, and Draper. A work party will be scheduled to modify the telescopes when the additional four arrive.

2016 SLAStrofest

Joan Carman indicated that SLAStrofest will be held on June 11, 2016 at the Whitmore Library. She will be in contact with those that are assisting with putting this on.

Astronomy Day

Joan indicated that the Clarke Planetarium would like us to set up the SLAS display there from 1:00-4:00 PM on May 14, 2016. They would also encourage us to have some solar telescopes available for the public to look through. Also, in conjunction with Astronomy Day will be the Harmon's star party on Friday, May 13, 2016. At that star party we will be giving away two 6-inch dobsonian telescopes and perhaps two first scopes (one lacking the accessory kit).

Old Business

There were no old business items.

New Business

There were no new business items.

Pay Bills

A check was written to Rodger Fry for \$100 in compensation for the Utah Corporate Solicitation Renewal, one to Ryan Simpkins for \$50.00 to pay for the Facebook ad and one to Joan Carman for \$4,130.50 to pay for astronomy books, SLAS pins, and accessories for the library scopes.

Joan Carman introduced the Speaker, Sydney J. Chamberlin from Penn State University

Her topic was "Listening to the Universe with Red Stars and Lasers" (a comprehensive summary of the detection of gravitational waves with LIGO).

This was an excellent presentation and was well accepted by those in attendance. The lecture portion of the meeting lasted until 8:40PM including an active Q & A session.
