12 September 2018

Meeting called to order: 7:00 pm

Budget — President John Johansen started the meeting inquiring about the status of the budget. Jim said he was still working on it.

John gave a review that the visit by Pranvera went very well and he also wanted to thank everyone for the accommodations and hospitality toward her.

Clark Planetarium - two representatives from the Clark Planetarium were at the Wheeler Park star party in August and it went very well. We will continue to coordinate with them on these events.

Joan announced the SLAStrofest will be on Saturday, November 10, at the Sandy County Library. This will be an all-day event from 10-5. She will email the agenda to John who will then send it out as a SLAS blast and put it on the website calendar. SLAStrofest is focused on helping new members of the club get better acquainted with astronomy, but please note that ANY member is welcome to come.

Solstice Party - John will double check with Golden Corral on the reservations. This party takes the place of the General Meeting in December.

Elections — after a long discussion, Nate motioned that all interested candidates will be "write-ins" since candidates were not mentioned in the August General Meeting. Nate motioned this and Jim seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous by the board. Jim suggested that John send a SLAS blast informing members that it will be a "write-in" election.

Officers' Reports:

John mentioned that the group Utah Backcountry Pilots has contacted him for possible star parties. He handed this over to Jim Keane, who is in charge of the special and school star parties.
