It is hard to put into words the strong influence that the late Siegfried Jachmann had on the Salt Lake Astronomical Society.

Siegfried Jachmann passed away in his sleep on July 7, 2018 while taking a nap prior to a star party at Cedar Brakes that evening.

Siegfried became a member of the Salt Lake Astronomical Society on September 1, 1978 and was a driving force in molding SLAS into what we are today. He served on the board in several positions including president several times. He also was a strong advocate of building up SPOC into the fine facility it is today. He held a dream of the potential benefits of having an observatory available to the public within a 30-minute drive of Salt Lake City. He nurtured a strong relationship with the management of the Harmon's grocery store chain and convinced them to be the major donor for the building that bears their name.

Siegfried was very vocal about issues that he felt important and this attribute helped promote his passion of bringing astronomy to the public which he supported strongly until his death.

Siegfried will truly be missed by all.

Comprehensive Budget

Since Jim Keane was absent and the first item on the agenda was regarding the budget, President John Johansen asked Denise if Jim had coordinated with her about the budget and Denise reported that he hadn't yet. This will be saved for September's board meeting.

Clark Planetarium Partnership

John reported that, in light of the Clark Planetarium wanting to partner with us more, they will be joining us for the Wheeler Park Star Party on August 31.

The Council for this event said there were about 35,000 patrons that showed. Joan said that we definitely need more volunteers for next year. Brent Watson suggested we do short classes on astronomy.

August Speaker

Pranvera Hyseni, Kosovo student, will be speaking next week, August 15, at our General Meeting. The topic will be on various astronomy subjects and her experiences. Thank you to Tony for letting her stay in his motor home. Various members as well as the board will help with meals and transportation during her stay. John suggested we have "Advanced Training" BEFORE the meeting to further welcome Pranvera. She will stay August 15-18.

Astronomy Workshop

Former member, Brent Watson, presented a very comprehensive booklet titled, "The Astronomy Workshop". This is designed to teach us ALL the basics of astronomy and telescopes. He's presented this in other states around the region through his outreach program through his company. This is designed to get people of all ages excited about astronomy and help with member retention in general. There was an extensive discussion about this. Joan Carman said she will organize a SLAStrofest for this year. This is a one-day workshop held annually. John asked the Board to vote to incorporate this in General Meetings as well. Tony Sarras said the next imaging session will be this Friday, August 10. Imaging is also known as astrophotography. He's been concerned that this gets low attendance and perhaps doesn't get enough advertising. John said he now puts this event on the website calendar. This event meets at the U of U campus and they remotely operate the Eccles telescope outside of Milford.

Old Business

Enid Norton reported that the Camp Wapiti Star Party was a success. This is an annual event. 75 people total this year. Three books were given away. Sky Charts were given to the kids. The planispheres worked really well.
